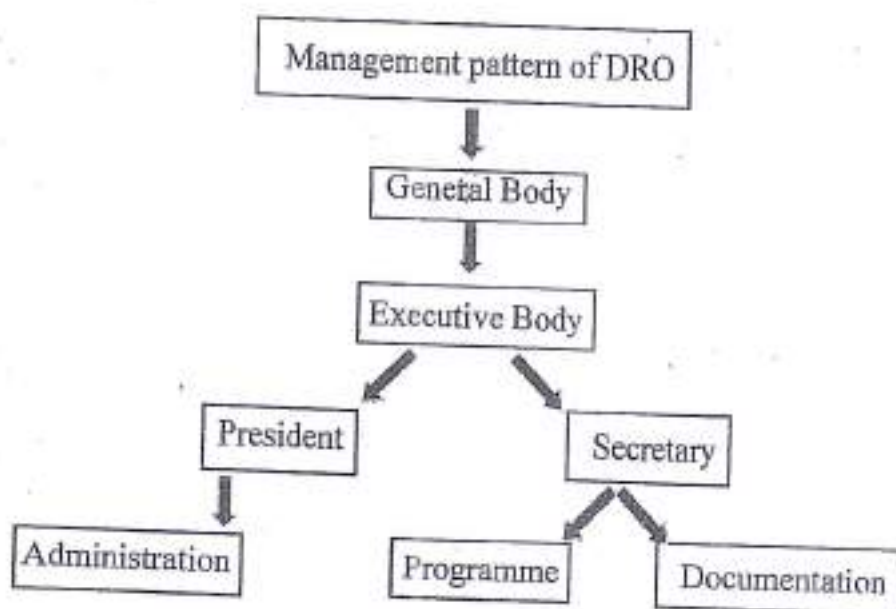

A brief Area Background

Nayagarh District is a tribal dominated and the concentration of habitation is the rural areas. Nayagarh District is one of the coastal districts of Odisha predominately inhabited by the tribal and economically weaker section. Nayagarh District at present face different challenges and there are others in the rural set up also very poor and vulnerable.

Nayagarh District is known for its draught, distress, destitute and migration. Although poverty is widespread in Odisha the situation of the District need special attention owing to the recurrence of cyclone, dearth of food and lack of employment for the disable, poor and down trodden. The situation can be summerised very worst where majority of the backward community dwells with the pathetic condition Under develop syndrome is unfortunately converged in the accentuating the deprivation and exploitation of rural mass leading to starvation and mass exodus.

The average land holding among the people is 0-1 acer (this does not necessarily mean have legal holding). The local money heavily depends on agriculture, forest and wage labour. Due to the exploitation both socially and economically the tribes are characterized by extremely low level of literacy and pre agricultural level of technology and lag behind the rest of the society. The tribals are nutrition deficiency in children anemia is widely prevalent especially in pregnant women, hematological disorders, sickle cell, seasonal disease like diarrhea, malaria, Tuberculosis, skin diseases, leprosy, goiter etc. are common disease. Overall education status of the area is very poor in the district. The literacy of Daspalla block is 87% particularly among the tribal which is one of the lowest (37.09%) being the district average. In the above backdrop, DSO has strived hard to make the stakeholders aware of their status and actively participate in their development.

Enabling creation of community level institutions, process, approach, mechanism and capacity building of the stakeholders are vital elements in the process of human and institutional development. We focus to work based on the local context as follows

Highlights of Activities 2017-18

1. Ensuring Health Rights-based Activities.

Right-based activities are undertaken with a convergence of efforts where people's Organisation, PRI, youth Clubs, Professionals join together to organise rallies and demonstrations. Ignorance of health hygiene interlines lack of awareness on available health facilities leading to non-utilisation of the health infrastructure and inaccessibility of the facilities are primary reasons of poor health condition of the people. Therefore awareness generation and promotion of demand for securing health entitlement have been the core of DROs work in its programme on health.

2. Awareness on HIV/AIDS challenges

HIV/AIDS has posed a great challenge for all of us in order to create mass awareness among the people on HIV/AIDS. DRO sought to make best use of the traditional method of information dissemination. Awareness generation and information dissemination on HIV/Aids has been done through cultural programmes. As a result of the effort, the taboos and inhibition for discussion on HIV/AIDS in the community has own away.

3. Micro Finance through SHGs

In the changing context the goal is to make micro finance a dispeancer not just of credit but averity of social goods and service to the rural poor. They have manifested their feeling of self-worth and self-dignity, behavioral changes, communication skill, decision making capacity and above all participation in the life of the community. Livelihood, diversification in linking up with increased incomes and savings are critical to reducing vulnerability of rural communities. In all the programme villages, DRO supports to formation and strengthening of SHGs. The basic premise is to encourage thrift among the women disables link up with the financial institutions. However these group provide a platform for bringing women together to discuss issues of common concern. Over time women gain confidence to articulate their concerns even in the large village meetings.

3.1 Formation of Self Help Group

From the inception DRO has given stress on formation and strengthening of self-help groups. Group formation gather momentum gradually as socio-economic impact of involvement as stated to become visible. Meanwhile, the organization has formed 11 SHGs and enhanced the capacity of its functionaries to work in micro finance.

4. Women Empowerment

DRO has taken care to include gender dynamics in various aspects of its works since beginning of the organization. Women have been promoted and proactively motivated to participate in all the programmes and activities. Especially in the process of networking efforts have been made to make women part of the critical decision making structures.

5. Artisan Development



Keeping in mind the needs of the rural artisans and to prevent their exploitation by the middle men, DRO started campaign an awareness programmes and welfare of the carpenter and shoe maker artsans. Organised the artisans and make them in a SHG and now they opened a bank account at SBI Daspalla and making their transactions, inter loaning etc.

6. Promotion of women participation

In all the community organizations women are encouraged to participate in palli sabhas and gram sabhas as a result of which women participation in institutions of self governance has

witnessed an increasing trend. Women participation has been promoted in all the programmes organized, conducted and facilitated by the organization (rallies, demonstration, celebration of conventional days, capacity building training etc. Women participation in the development has rise to a level where women have been able to break the stereotype of division of labour in undertaking skilled job like Agarvati, small business etc.

7. Institution Building

The orientation programme laid emphasis on the process of resource mobilization, creation of second-line leadership, independent programme management, planning, monitoring and evaluation in projects with consortium approach, network and alliance building. Common action on the basis of identification of the issues at the local level has been prioritized during the reported period. Common action has a two-fold purpose of ensuring the security of livelihood and broadbase the people's Organisation. Common action has been undertaken in the form of blooming the Young talents, Child Labour prevention programme. Promotion of youth activities, organizing cultural programmes, Games & Sports, awareness o minimizing Road Mishaps, NREGS Programme on Govt. scheme and women right, Rally on Land to landles, Awareness campaign on disables in the operational area.

8. Policy & Advocacy.

DRO believes in grssroot level policy advocacy.. Lobby & advocacy activities above village level are almost exclusively taken care of at present by a relatively limited number of staff members within DRO as an NGO. Apart, the people's organizations which have been promoted over the years of our development journey also take a more pro-active role with regard to lobby and advocacy above village level. The village level committee, which is induced under various programmes have been stimulated and supported to play a pro-active role in this area.

9. Right to information.

The right to information has been recognized as a basic human right, which uphold the inherent dignity of all human beings. It forms the vital foundation of participatory democracy and is essential to ensure accountability and good governance. But there is a Lack of information among the general public regarding the mission, vision as well as the privileges and facilities. Therefore the civil society organizations are yet to pull the best resources among the people to serve their goal. Collective thinking in this regard is yet to begin in this sector.

10. Documentation.

Process documentation is an ongoing activity of the organization. Particularly the organization is concentrated on impact study to understand the result obtained in terms of planning, and programmes. At present, the organization is concentrating on the areas of efficient Management of Information System (MIS) so as to claim as sustainable information centre.

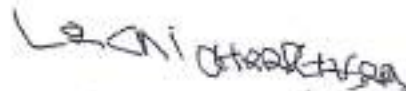

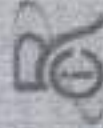
